Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Meadow Woods ES serves 655 students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through fifth. The student population's ethnicity is made of 71% Hispanic and 29% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 70% White, 21% Black, 0% Native, 3% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 5% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Edmi Figueroa and Assistant Principal Rachel Fox. Meadow Woods ES is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include the Accelerated Reader Program that fosters independent reading. This program is implemented throughout the year and it is data driven. Students are able to track their own progress and plan next steps to achieve their independent reading goals. We have a "Walk to Read" Acceleration Program, the Dramatic Education After School Program, After School Tutoring, Battle of the Books, and Choir and Dance Clubs. We also count on a very strong Family Resource Center administered by our Parent Engagement Liaison, who offers monthly learning labs to our families.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Meadow Woods ES indicates that the average age of the collection is 2013 and the number of books per student is 16. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Meadow Woods ES does meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- The amount of books in our collection meets the criteria for highly effective standards as there are 16 items per student.
- OCPS has provided over 1,000 eBook titles to our school collection.
- As a school, students did not move significantly in any direction in the state assessments.
- 71% of students are Hispanic but only 19% of our titles represent this ethnicity.

Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

(adapted from https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/results/2023.stml) In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on **provisional** achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewide assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency.

Collection Analysis

The collection is developed for and influenced by students, their interests, academic needs and alignment to the curriculum. The data below is a snapshot of the collection based on a Titlewise Analysis from July 2023. Purchasing or weeding after that time is not reflected in this data.
